Proposed Use of Structure: Pedestrian Walkway highlighting the history of Basketball in our community


Description of project: The location of the project is an alley recently vacated to vehicular traffic during a recent \$11 million infrastructure reconstruction and redesign of our Historic Downtown Square. When standing in this alley, the Memorial Gymnasium is in view which makes it the perfect location for this Alley-Oop project. This project will include a walking tour of the history of basketball in our community using informational exhibits. QR codes that link to YouTube videos will depict Lebanon's basketball history on a smartphone-based tour app called Distrix that will walk visitors through a multimedia narrated historical presentation. When approaching the alley from the newly renovated Courthouse Square, visitors will be greeted overhead by a 14' high Custom fabricated aluminum archway mounted to 6" square black posts. The archway features the silhouette of a basketball net stretched from one end to the other, with Memorial Gymnasium as a backdrop. In the center of the arch is a 36" diameter sign panel with laminated digital print graphics that feature a newly developed logo depicting a basketball in place of our famed Courthouse dome, with the slogan "This is Home and Home is Basketball". Visitors will also be greeted by two 24" cast concrete orange and black basketball bollards at the entrance to this pedestrian alley. The pavement surface of the alley will be cleaned, prepped, and primed with a painted floor graphic topped off with a protective clear coat. The graphic will feature a solid yellow-gold surface with the "This is Home and Home is Basketball" logo along with painted basketball court lines at each end of the alley. The middle of the alley features a half court line with an outline of a basketball, along with painted circles for the younger kids to hop from one to the next, mimicking a bouncing basketball. The facades of the buildings that flank each side of the alley will feature 7 digitally printing changeable flex vinyl graphics & frames of various sizes mounted to the brick with masonry fasteners. These changeable graphics are of various size including four 5' x 6', four 4' x 4', and four 8' x 15' Lebanon Basketball depictions. They include historical photos of Rick "The Rocket" Mount and the 1912 State Championship team to name a few. The alley also contains an electrical control box that

will be laminated with a digitally printed basketball graphic. Visitors will also have the opportunity to take a seat in the alley at a black metal table and chairs under a yellow-gold umbrella that matches the furniture in the plaza on Meridian Street.
