Hi Kristi,

Thank you for your help on the phone this week. Jeff and I would like for our concern to be made part of the commissioner's packets for the August 16 meeting, in regard to the Homewood Health Campus expansion. We would also like to be on the agenda to speak.

We would like to voice our concern as well as reach out for help. When we purchased our property at 465 W 250 N Lebanon, in 1999, we did not have an issue with flooding. After Trilogy Health Services constructed Homewood Health Campus, we started to notice flooding on the south-east portion of our property. For several years it was not severe, but it did occur frequently, and we did lose several trees, shrubs, and plants on the east and south sides of property due to the wet soil. The trees have either uprooted or died. It wasn't until the most recent Walmart building and the Goodwill building were developed that we have literally been drowning. The soil from the Walmart retention pond was placed on the Goodwill property before construction began. This created a terrible situation for us. With Homewood's elevation as well as Goodwill's elevation being higher than our elevation, it forced severe flooding on our property. We spoke in person with Mayor Lewis, several years ago. We were told there really isn't anything the city could do to help us. Homewood did put in a drainage pipe a few years ago. We were hopeful this would alleviate our issues. It did not. It has gradually gotten worse. We are now battling issues with our septic system and water in our basement. We never had issues with our basement before. This is of great concern to us since René has severe allergies. We would appreciate the opportunity to speak at the August 16, 2021, hearing.
