## ORDINANCE #02-06

**ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN  
EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA  
BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2003**

**SECTION 1:** BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE City of Lebanon, Indiana two-thirds of its members being present and concurring therein:

**SECTION 2:** That the maximum salaries of the following employees of City of Lebanon, beginning January 1, 2003 be as follows:

**Section 7.** This ordinance shall take effect January 1, 2003.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO THE TAXPAYERS OF LEBANON COUNTY, CITY, TOWN OR FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, OF LEBANON COUNTY, CITY, TOWN OR FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, OF LEBANON COUNCIL, COMMON/TOWN COUNCIL OR BOARD OF LEBANON AT CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS ON AUGUST 26, 2002, AT 7:30 P.M. A.M./P.M. WILL CONDUCT A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE BUDGET. FOLLOWING THIS MEETING, ANY TEN OR MORE TAXPAYERS MAY OBJECT TO A BUDGET, TAX RATE, OR TAX LEVY BY FILING AN OBJECTING PETITION WITH THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION WITHIN SEVEN DAYS AFTER THE HEARING. THE OBJECTING PETITION MUST IDENTIFY THE PROVISIONS OF THE BUDGET, TAX RATE OR TAX LEVY THAT TAXPAYERS OBJECT TO. IF A PETITION IS FILED, THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION SHALL ADOPT WITH ITS BUDGET A FINDING CONCERNING THE OBJECTIONS FILED AND TESTIMONY PRESENTED. FOLLOWING THE AFOREMENTIONED MEETING, THE FISCAL BODY WILL MEET AT CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2002, AT 7:30 P.M. A.M./P.M. TO ADOPT THE FOLLOWING BUDGET.

TAXPAYERS APPEARING AT THE HEARING SHALL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD. PURSUANT TO IC 6-1.1-17-13. AFTER THE TAX LEVIES HAVE BEEN DETERMINED, FIXED BY THE APPROPRIATE GOVERNING BODY, AND THE TAX RATES PUBLISHED BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR, TEN OR MORE TAXPAYERS OBJECTING TO THE LEVIES MAY APPEAL TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE BY FILING A PETITION WITH THE COUNTY AUDITOR. THE PETITION MUST BE FILED ON OR BEFORE THE TENTH DAY AFTER PUBLICATION OF THE PROPOSED TAX RATES CHARGED. THE COUNTY AUDITOR WILL THEN FORWARD THE OBJECTION PETITION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE FOR CONSIDERATION. HOWEVER, A GROUP OF TEN OR MORE TAXPAYERS MAY NOT INITIATE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE NOTICE OF TAX RATES PUBLISHED BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR IF LESS THAN SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT (75%) OF THE OBJECTING TAXPAYERS WERE NOT OBJECTING TAXPAYERS ON THE OBJECTION PETITION FILED UPON PUBLICATION OF THE NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS OF BUDGET ESTIMATES AND TAX LEVIES PUBLISHED BY THE UNIT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY, CITY, TOWN OR FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT OF LEBANON AND ITS INSTITUTIONS FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2003 THE SUMS OF MONEY SHOWN ON BUDGET FORM 4-A ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED AND ORDERED SET APART OUT OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS HEREIN NAMED AND FOR THE PURPOSES HEREIN SPECIFIED, SUBJECT TO THE LAWS GOVERNING THE SAME. TWO (2) COPIES OF BUDGET FORM 4-A AND 4-B FOR ALL FUNDS AND DEPARTMENTS ARE MADE A PART OF THE BUDGET REPORT AND SUBMITTED HEREWITH.
