

**ORDINANCE NO. 2017-10**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, BOONE COUNTY, INDIANA CONCERNING THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Lebanon (the "City") is a duly formed municipal corporation within the State of Indiana governed by its duly elected Mayor and Common Council ("Common Council"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Common Council are the executive and legislative bodies and are by law authorized to adopt ordinances for the protection of the public health, safety, and general welfare of its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the unregulated consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places is detrimental to the safety, and general welfare of its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the Ordinance amends previously approved Ordinance 75-7 and Ordinance 75-14; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, meeting in regular session, as follows:

**Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

**Section 2.** As of the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 130: General Offenses Section: 06 of the City Code of Ordinances shall be amended in accordance with Exhibit A.

**Section 3.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect in accordance with Indiana Law, upon passage of any applicable waiting periods, all as provided by the laws of the State of Indiana. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby ordered amended or repealed. All acts pursuant to the adoption of this Ordinance are hereby ratified.

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





EXHIBIT A

**CHAPTER 130: GENERAL OFFENSES**

**130.06 CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN PUBLIC PLACES.**

- (A) The consumption of alcoholic beverages, without prior approval from the Board of Public Works and Safety, in any public place in the limits of the city is hereby declared to be unlawful and a public nuisance.
- (B) For the purposes of this section the term *PUBLIC PLACE* is hereby defined to be any government-owned building, within the city and/or the streets, alleys, parks, and municipally owned property of the city.
- (C) Alcohol is not permitted within City parks.
- (D) In regard to specific events that wish to serve alcohol and occur in a public place or on public property, event organizers must request and receive approval from the Board of Public Works and Safety prior to the event. Organizers must obtain any temporary permits required by the State of Indiana. Approval of such a request is subject to the Board of Public Works and Safety discretion and may or may not be approved.
- (E) In regard to restaurants that wish to serve alcohol on public property, such as a sidewalk or alley, outside of their establishment must request and receive approval from the Board of Public Works and Safety prior to the service of alcohol in that area. Establishments must be in full compliance with any applicable regulations required by the State of Indiana. Approval of such a request is subject to the Board of Public Works and Safety discretion and may or may not be approved.
