

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE LEBANON SAFETY COUNCIL.

Filed - "Safety Council"

- A. Superior Street:
The Safety Council finds no need for one side parking on Superior street, as it is not a through street. However, if the Common Council feels there is a need for one side parking, then there be no parking on the south side of the street. It is the feeling of the Safety Committee that the Auto Transports which park on Superior Street are of a less hazard there than on a more traveled street.
- B. New Harney School:
It is recommended that "No Stopping or Standing" signs be erected on the east side of the street, and that "No Parking, Loading Zone" be erected on the West side of the street from Harney Drive to Camp Street.
- C. NEW HIGH SCHOOL:
In order to understand the situation at the high school it is necessary to present some background material.. The Holding Company owns the ground upon which the building, parking area and drive from Essex street occupy. The Lebanon Utilities own the rest of the ground which they rent to the Holding Company for \$1.00 per year on a 99 year lease. The Holding Company is responsible for any street put in on the ground they own, and the School City is responsible for any improvements on the ground leased from the Utilities.

With this in mind, the situation as it now exists looks bad. The holding company plans to open just one street; Essex. All busses, student and teacher autos, patrons autos, delivery trucks, oil trucks, supplies, etc., will use this one drive. (See drawing.) It will be of blacktop construction.

The Safety Council then asked Mr. Christian, Supt. of Schools, if Outer Drive North and Outer Drive South would be opened by the School City. He said no plans were made to open them in the near future; possibly when the new gym is built.

This group strongly urges all three streets be opened and made passable with crushed stone: That is, Essex, Outer Drive North and Outer Drive South. We also recommend that no parking on either side be enforced on the above streets from East Street to the School parking lots.

ORDINANCE NO. 49, 1957 - ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1958
