

east of South East Street; run thence south with said center line of said alley to the center line of East South Street; run thence west with said center line of East South Street to the center line of South East Street; run thence south with said center line of South East Street; to the center line of East Elm Street; run thence west with said center line of Elm Street to the center line of South Lebanon Street; run thence north with said center line of South Lebanon Street to the center line of the New York Central Railroad right-of-way; run thence northwest with said center line of said railroad right-of-way to the center line of Ryan Street; run thence north with said center line of Ryan Street to the center line of West Main Street; run thence east with said center line of West Main Street to the center line of the first north and south alley west of West Street; run thence north with said center line of said alley to the center line of Washington Street; run thence east with said center line of Washington Street to a point 83 1/2 feet west of the center line of West Street; run thence north a distance of 134 feet; run thence east to the center line of West Street; run thence north with said center line of West Street to the center line of West North Street; run thence east with said center line of West North Street to the place of beginning.

And that all other real estate within said City not included within the above boundaries is hereby designated to be in Fire Zone No. 2.

SECTION 2: No additional Liquid Petroleum gas installations will be permitted in Fire Zone No. 1 provided, also, that any other restrictions heretofore adopted by Ordinance pertaining to Fire Zone No. 1, are hereby adopted by reference and made a part of this ordinance. All persons intending to install new or replacement Liquid Petroleum units in the City of Lebanon shall register their intentions with the Building Inspector or Fire Chief of Lebanon, showing the location of the real estate and the location of the real estate where such installation is to be made, and all installation must comply fully with the State Fire Regulations and the ordinances of the City of Lebanon.

A permit shall be secured from said Fire Chief or Building Inspector and said Fire Chief shall make an inspection of said installation.

SECTION 3: Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, on conviction, be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to which may be added imprisonment in the County Jail for any period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law.
