ORDINANCE NO. 55 - SUPPLEMENTAL ORDINANCE FIXING SALARIES OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1958.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, two-thirds of its members being present and concurring therein:

SECTION I: That the following maximum hourly, weekly and semi-monthly salary schedule be added to Section 6, Recreation Department.

B. Program Assistants:

- Maximum hourly salary - - - - - \$ 1.75
- Maximum weekly salary - - - - - 70.00
- Maximum semi-monthly salary - - - - - 150.00

SECTION II: This ordinance is supplemental and additional to Ordinance 49, 1957, passed by the Common Council on the 9th day of September, 1957 and shall be construed therewith.

Passed by the Common Council under suspension of the rules, and approved by me this 24th day of February, 1958.
