

It is agreed and mutually understood by and between the parties to this contract that the City of Lebanon shall employ two additional firemen to assist in fighting and extinguishing to the best of their ability the fires occurring in said City and within said Center Township. It is further agreed and mutually understood by and between the parties that the City of Lebanon may use said truck for emergency purposes at any time within the term of this contract.

It is further agreed that this contract shall begin as of this date, to-wit: January 1, 1959 and extend to the 31st day of December, 1960. It is further agreed between these parties that said Center Township shall pay to the City of Lebanon, Indiana, from time to time as they are billed therefor a sufficient sum of money to pay two additional firemen together with insurance charges as above provided, laundry, clothing allowance and firemen's pension, and that all said charges for employing firemen, for gasing, oiling and repairing said fire truck and for insurance charges, laundry, clothing allowance and firemen's pension for said firemen shall be paid by Center Township as the same are billed therefor by said City.
