

Lebanon, Indiana.

The court further finds that said Prairie Creek Avenue is impossible to use as a street or avenue for the reason that the description of said Prairie Creek Avenue describes the location of Prairie Creek in Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, between the streets of North Meridian and North Lebanon Street.

The court further finds that the vacation of said Prairie Creek Avenue will be of a public and private benefit, but that said vacation should be subject to the laws of the State of Indiana as the same shall apply to Prairie Creek only for purpose of drainage.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that Prairie Creek Avenue as the same exists and is platted between North Meridian Street and North Lebanon Street and running in an east-west direction between said street in the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, shall and the same is hereby declared vacated.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said vacation of Prairie Creek Avenue shall be subject to the laws of the State of Indiana for the maintenance and upkeep of the Prairie Creek drainage ditch as the same exists between North Meridian Street and North Lebanon Street in the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana.

It is further ordered and decreed that by this judgment and decree that the land known as Prairie Creek Avenue and platted at 50 feet in width shall be returned to and become a part of the lands from which it was originally dedicated, to-wit: -- that the north half of Prairie Creek Avenue shall be returned to Lots 34, 33, 32, 31, 30, 29 and 10 in Trips Addition to Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana; that the south half of Prairie Creek Avenue shall be returned to Lot 9 and to a certain alley which lies between Prairie Creek Avenue and which abuts Lots 6, 5, 4 and 3 in Trips Addition and Lots 2 and 1 all in Trips Addition to Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana.

It is further ordered that costs in this matter in the sum of \$30.22 shall be taxed against the petitioners herein.

DECLARATORY RESOLUTION NO. 19 - DECLARATORY RESOLUTION TO VACATE PART OF A STREET

*Filed - Vacation of Streets and Alleys*

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Lebanon, Indiana that:

SECTION 1. It is deemed necessary, in the interests of Public Health and Safety, to vacate a portion of Coulson Street in the City of Lebanon, Indiana, which portion of said street is described as follows:

Part of the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter in Section 25, Township north, range 1 west. More particularly described as follows: commencing at the northeast corner of Lot No. 259 West Fairview Addition and run thence east along the south line of Esplanade Street 50 feet more or less to the northwest corner of Lot No. 258 of said addition; run thence south along the west line of Lot No. 258, 42 feet more or less to southwest corner thereof; run thence west 50 feet more or less to the southeast corner of Lot No. 259 of said addition and run thence north along the east line of Lot No. 259, 42 feet more or less to the place of beginning.

SECTION 2. The property which will be injuriously or benifidally affected by said vacation is owned by Charles Leo Sparks.

SECTION 3. After approval by the Common Council, a copy of this resolution be published and a hearing be held according to law on the 10th day of February, 1958 at 2:00 o'clock P. M. for objection and remonstrances to be presented to the vacation above set out.
