

RESOLUTION NO. 2, 1962: RESOLUTION RENAMING CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA

Filed Resolutions

WHEREAS the history of Lebanon indicates that Colonel George L. Kinnard and General James P. Drake were the first and original owners of the land which formed the original plat of Lebanon;

And WHEREAS James G. Blair had built a cabin just southeast of the present intersection of Meridian and Superior streets and was the first person to be Buried in old Cedar Hill Cemetary;

And WHEREAS John Patterson was the second settler in the newly founded and platted town in a cabin on the lot on the northwest corner of the intersection of Main and Lebanon streets;

And WHEREAS William M. Smith was the third to settle in the new town, building his cabin on West Main Street on a lot now occupied by the Shelby building;

And WHEREAS there are certain streets in the City of Lebanon which in our opinion should be renamed;

NOW THEREFORE, a street called Hoy Street, existing in the south part of town, located between the New York Central tracks and running south to Sycamore Street; and since this street's name conflicts with an existing Hoy Avenue in the north part of Lebanon and is confusing to the public and to the fire department;

NOW THEREFORE, the members of the Common Council of the City of Lebanon do hereby resolve that said Hoy Street shall be changed to Kinnard Street in memory of the above named early settler.

We further resolve that the street now designated as "A" Street, extending south from West Washington Street to West South Street, should be designated hereafter as Drake Street. Further, that the street now designated as "B" Street, extending south from West Washington Street to West Pearl Street, shall hereafter be known as Blair Street. Further, the street now designated as "C" Street, extending south from Lafayette Avenue to West Noble Street, shall hereafter be known as Patterson Street. Finally, the street now designated as "D" Street, extending south from West Main Street to West South Street, shall hereafter be known as Smith Street. All of the above names honoring the aforementioned early settlers of the City of Lebanon.

ORDINANCE NO. 2 - AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DEPARTMENTS NAMED FOR THE YEAR 1962, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CLERK-TREASURER OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA

Filed Appropriation Special

WHEREAS: Certain extraordinary conditions have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, so that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget for the various functions of City Government, to meet such extraordinary emergencies:

SECTION 1. Be it Ordained By The Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, that for the expense of City Government the following sums of money are hereby appropriated and set apart out of the General Fund for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same, such sums herein appropriated shall be held to include all expenditures authorized to be made during the year, unless otherwise expressly stipulated and provided by law.

SECTION 2. That for said fiscal period there is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund, the following specified amounts to meet such extraordinary emergencies which are hereby declared to exist:

GENERAL FUND:
