

CONTRACT REGARDING THE LEASE OF A CERTAIN PARKING LOT AND THE PLACING OF METERS THEREON

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 14th day of October, 1963, by and between the Board of Public Works of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, hereinafter called the City, and Harold B. Lawler and Madge Lawler, husband and wife, Lebanon, Indiana, hereinafter called the Owner, is as follows:

WHEREAS, the City has in force a parking ordinance by which it maintains and uses parking meters for the purpose of facilitating traffic, and,

WHEREAS, the present metered area in said City is insufficient to accomodate all the necessary uses therefore, and,

WHEREAS, the Owner owns a lot suitable for parking adjacent to said metered area in said City, and,

WHEREAS, it is a desire of both the City and the Owner to do whatever is best for the public interest, it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. The City shall lease the following described real estate, to wit:

Lot No. 7, Block 9, Original Plat of the City of Lebanon, Indiana.

on a month to month basis beginning October 14, 1963, and monthly thereafter. The City shall further police and maintain said meters and lot, make the collections therefrom and keep an account of the collections.

2. The City agrees to pay as rental for said lot on the same basis as they have been paying heretofore on a contract executed On October 13, 1958, by and between said parties.

3. The City will relieve and hold owner harmless for all claims for damage which might result from the operation of said lot by said City.

4. The minimum fees per metered space for parking on said lot shall be five (5¢) for a period of one and one-half (1½) hours, ten (10¢) cents for a period of three (3) hours, and that said meters shall have sufficient time on them to permit all day parking.

5. That at any time upon the termination of this lease by either party, that the City shall have the right to remove the meter heads.

ORDINANCE NO. 14 - AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DEPARTMENTS NAMED FOR THE YEAR 1963, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CLERK-TREASURER OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA

WHEREAS: Certain extraordinary conditions have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, so that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget for the various functions of City Government, to meet such extraordinary emergencies;

SECTION 1. Be It Ordained By The Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, that for the expense of City Government the following sums of money are hereby appropriated and set apart out of the General Fund for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same, such sums herein appropriated shall be held to include all expenditures authorized to be made during the year, unless otherwise expressly stipulated and provided by law.

SECTION 2. That for said fiscal period there is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund, the following specified amounts to meet such extraordinary emergencies which are hereby declared to exist:

GENERAL FUND:
