ORDINANCE NO. 26

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES OR OTHER VEHICLES ON EITHER SIDE OF ESPLANADE STREET BETWEEN LEBANON STREET AND WEST STREET

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, two-thirds of its members being present and concurring therein:

Section I: It shall be unlawful to park or leave standing any automobile, motor truck, bus or any other vehicle on either side of Esplanade Street in said City, between North Lebanon Street and North West Street in said City at any time.

Section II: Any person violating the provisions of Section I hereof shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum of not less than One (\$1.00) Dollar nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Section III: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and legal publication as required by law.
