ORDINANCE NO. 2 - 68

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING OF AND PROVIDING FOR DISPOSAL OF JUNKED, WRECKED, ABANDONED, DISASSEMBLED, OR UNOPERABLE AND UNLICENSED MOTOR VEHICLES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana that:

Section 1. Because of the danger to health from vermin and insects and rodents and because of the danger to the safety of children attracted by such vehicles, abandoned and junked motor vehicles are hereby declared to be nuisances, except in lawfully operated junk yards.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to store or allow to remain in the open upon public or private property within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, any disassembled, or unoperable and unlicensed, or any junked, wrecked or abandoned motor vehicle for a period of five (5) or more days on public property, or for a period of fifteen (15) or more days on private property, unless it is in connection with an automotive sales or repair business enterprise which operates under a duly issued and exhibited store license and is located in a properly zoned area.

Section 3. Whenever the Chief of Police of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, shall find any such vehicle placed or stored in the open upon public property within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, he shall issue an order to the owner of such vehicle to remove such vehicle within three (3) days. Notice of such order shall be placed upon said vehicle. If such vehicle is not removed within three (3) days pursuant to said order and notice, the Chief of Police shall cause such vehicle to be removed by a junk or salvage yard or wrecker service to be paid by the owner of such vehicle.

Section 4. Whenever the Chief of Police of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, shall find any such vehicle placed or stored in the open upon private property within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, he shall issue an order to the owner of such vehicle to remove such vehicle within ten (10) days. Notice of such order shall be placed upon such vehicle and copies of such notice shall be served upon any adult occupying the real estate on which said vehicle is located and also upon the owner of the vehicle, if his name and whereabouts be known. If no occupant of the real
