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PETITION FOR ANNEXATION

Comes now the Young Men's Christian Association of Greater Indianapolis and respectfully shows:

1. That it is an Indiana Corporation organized and authorized to do business under the Indiana Not for Profit Corporation Act.

2. That said Corporation is the owner of the following described property in Boone County, Indiana:

Part of the west half of the northeast quarter of Section 25, Township 19 North, Range 1 west of the second principal meridian, and consists of an irregularly shaped tract north of the county drainage ditch and approximately 450 feet west of State Road 39, the approximate size and location of which is shown on the drawing attached hereto as Exhibit A, containing approximately 10 acres.

That said real estate is contiguous to and adjacent to the present city limits of Lebanon, Indiana.

3. That your petitioner is the sole and only owner of the aforesaid real estate and, as such, constitutes more than fifty-one (51%) per cent of the ownership in said real estate as required by Burns Indiana Statute 48-720.

4. That the annexation of the above described territory into the city limits of Lebanon, Indiana, would be just and equitable, both to the city and its property owners and inhabitants and to the annexed territory and its property owners.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners request a special ordinance be submitted to the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, for the purpose of annexing into the city limits of Lebanon, Indiana, the real estate described above.

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ORDINANCE 2-70

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING UNINVITED SOLICITATIONS AT PRIVATE RESIDENCE IN THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana,
Section 1 The practice of going in and upon private residence in the City of Lebanon, Indiana by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant dealers or merchants, or transient vendors of merchandise not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise and/or disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same is hereby declared to be a nuisance is punishable as a misdemeanor as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects or refuses to comply with, or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be fined not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense. Each day that violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3 All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and specifically Ordinance No 67 passed by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon on the 28th day of June, 1926.

SECTION 4 This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage approval and publication according to law.
