

1 hereof, the fine shall be Two Dollars (\$2.00) for parking more than the two (2) hours provided for.

For overtime parking, except as above:

If the fine is paid within thirty (30) minutes of the time of discovery	\$.50
If paid within one (1) week	2.00
If paid within two (2) weeks (where a notice was required to be mailed)	5.00
If the case is required to be filed in the City Court plus costs to be taxed	5.00

Section 5. In addition to the penalties above provided for overtime parking around the Courthouse Square, any cars or motor vehicles which are parked for more than twenty-four (24) hours are subject to be towed in at the owners expense.

Section 6 All ordinances or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7 This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication thereof according to law.
