

(2) the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for all other goods to be offered by applicant the said certificate to be valid for a period of thirty days (30) from the date issued.

B. For residents of the City of Lebanon:

(1) The sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) for any goods to be offered, whether perishable and non-consumable, the same to be valid for a period of one (1) year from the date of issue.

SECTION 3. Certificate. Each person shall at all times, while soliciting or canvassing the City, carry upon his or her person the registration certificate and the same shall be exhibited by such registrant whenever he is required to do so by any police officer or requested to do so by any person solicited. Said certificate when issued shall be non-transferable.

SECTION 4 House-to-House Canvassing or Soliciting It shall be unlawful to engage in the business of going upon the premises of another for the purpose of soliciting orders, contributions or information, or for the purpose of selling or peddling, without the consent or invitation of the owner or occupant of such premises.

The fact that such canvasser, solicitor or peddler is a resident of the municipality, or the employer or proprietor of a business established in the municipality, shall be prima facie proof that the owner or occupant of such premises has given the consent required.

SECTION 5. Notice Regulating Soliciting. Every person desiring to secure the protection intended to be provided by the regulations pertaining to soliciting contained in this Ordinance, shall comply with the following directions, to-wit:

Notice of the determination by the occupant of giving invitation to solicitors, or the refusal of invitation to solicitors, to any residence shall be given in the manner following:

A weatherproof card, approximately three inches by four inches in size shall be exhibited upon or near the main entrance door to the residence indicating the determination by the occupant, containing the applicable words, as follows:

"ONLY SOLICITORS REGISTERED IN LEBANON INVITED."

or

"NO SOLICITORS INVITED ."

The letters shall be at least one-third (1/3) inch in height. For the purpose of uniformity, the cards shall be provided by the Chief of Police to persons requesting at the proportionate cost thereof.

Such cards so exhibited shall constitute sufficient notice to any solicitor of the determination by the occupant of the residence of the information contained thereon.

SECTION 6. Duty of Solicitors. It shall be the duty of every solicitor upon going onto any premises in the municipality upon which a residence as herein defined is located to first examine the Notice provided for in Section 5 of this Ordinance, if any is attached and be governed by the statement contained on the Notice. If the Notice states "Only Solicitors Registered In Lebanon Invited" then the solicitor not possessing a valid Certificate of Registration as herein provided shall immediately depart from the premises and if the notice states "No Solicitors Invited." then the solicitor, whether registered or not shall immediately and peacefully depart from the premises.

Any solicitor who has gained entrance to any residence, whether invited or not shall immediately and peacefully depart from the premises when requested to do so by the occupant.

SECTION 7 Uninvited Soliciting Prohibited. It is hereby declared to be unlawful and shall constitute a nuisance for any person to go upon any premises and ring the door bell or near any door, to create any sound in any other manner calculated to attract the attention of the occupant of such residence, for the purpose of securing an audience with the occupant thereof and engage in soliciting as herein defined in defiance of the Notice exhibited at the residence in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8 Exceptions The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to veterans under the Acts of 1895 of the State of Indiana, Chapter 121, as amended nor to the officers or employees of the City, County, State or Federal Government or any subdivision thereof when on official business.

SECTION 9 Revocation. Any such registration may be revoked by Mayor or Chief of Police because of any violation by the registrant of this Ordinance or of any other ordinance of the City, or for any State or Federal Law, or whenever the registrant shall cease to possess the qualifications and character required by the provisions of the original registration.

SECTION 10 Severance Clause If any section paragraph clause or provisions of this Ordinance shall be held invalid the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11 Penalty Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 12 Repealer All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions herewith and specifically Ordinance No. 26 of the City of Lebanon are hereby repealed.

SECTION 13 Effective Date This ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage and publication thereof, according to law. Passes this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December, in open council, 1970.
