

Between Williams Street and Cemetary--"slow, children playing" sign is bent and rusted. On Park Street.

Corner of Fordice and Park Street--stop signs, street sign, and "watch for children" signs are bent.

Park Drive and South Outer Drive--stop sign is bent.

Corner of Woodland and Park--All stop signs are generally rusted.

Corner of Park Drive and Essex Street--tree limbs need trimmed around street sign.

North Outer Drive and Park Street--no street sign indicating Park Drive.

Between Meridian and North Outer--one "no parking" sign rusted and one "no parking" sign bent.

Slightly North of Ulen entrance-- "speed limit 30" sign bent over.

Corner of Elizaville and Elm Swamp--street sign turned the wrong way and two stop signs painted over.

Chadwick Village--no signs at all in addition.

Corner of Meadow Lane and South Outer Drive--Street sign turned.

Corner of Woodland and Meadow Lane--stop sign bent.

Slightly east of Meadow Lane on Essex--no parking sign unreadable.

Corner of Ann Street and Main Street--no stop sign.

Corner of Ann Street and Williams--no stop sign.

On Fordice Street in the vicinity of Ann Street--"no parking" sign is unreadable.

On Grant Street in the vicinity of the bridge--"20 mile per hour" sign has been confiscated.

Corner of Grant and Fordice-- there needs to be a dead end sign since road around High School is usually blocked.

Fordice road between Methodist Church and second curve, there is a post with no sign.
