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SECTION 9: The grantee shall pay such fee as may reasonably assessed or charged by the City of Lebanon, Indiana, in connection with any of the approval or inspection required by the City Council; and, for such purposes Grantee agrees to pay to the City of Lebanon three percent of the Grantee's gross subscriber revenues per year from cable television operations in the community.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law. Passed by the Common Council and approved by me this 11th day of February, 1974.

ORDINANCE # 74-4

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE OWNERSHIP OF DOGS AND CATS WITHIN THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, PROHIBIT THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOGS WITHIN SAID CITY, ESTABLISHING A MUNICIPAL DOG POUND AND REPEALING CERTAIN ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person owning or harboring and dog to permit any such dog to run at large in any of the streets, alleys, public parks, business sections or commons of the City of Lebanon, Indiana.

SECTION 2: Any dog on the streets of the City of Lebanon, Indiana shall be on a leash and accompanied by his owner, When not on a leash such dogs shall be confined to the property of his owner.

SECTION 3: The owners of all dogs within the limits of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, shall purchase a license therefore from the office of the Clerk-Treasurer of said City. The license fee therefore shall be \$3.00 for male dogs and spayed females. The fee for an unspayed female dog shall be \$10.00.

The Clerk-Treasurer shall keep a register showing the name of the owner of each dog licensed and furnish each owner with a metal tag, upon which shall be impressed or inscribed a number. The Clerk-Treasurer shall give each owner a receipt for said license upon which shall be noted the number of the tag issued to the owner.

all such funds received from licenses shall be kept in a special fund and used for the operation a municipal Dog Pound hereinafter established.

SECTION 4: The License tags issued to the owners of dogs shall be attached to some durable material which shall be worn by the dog at all times. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove such collar or tag from such dog; provided, however, in case such tag is lost a substitute tag may be issued by the Clerk-Treasurer upon the payment of a fee of \$1.00.

It shall be a violation of this ordinance to attach the license tag issued hereunder to any dog other than that for which it was issued.

All such licenses hereunder shall expire one year from the date of issue. The failure of any owner to renew such license shall be a violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: Before the Clerk-Treasurer issues the license set out in Section 3 above the owner of a dog must show proof that said dog has been vaccinated for the disease of rabies. Failure to keep such dog vaccinated for rabies shall be a violation of this Ordinance.

Section 6: There is hereby established the position of Humane Officer in the City of Lebanon, Indiana. Such officer shall have the duty to collect all dogs found running at large within the City of Lebanon, Indiana, and take them to the City Dog Pound hereinafter established. Such Officer shall be appointed and dismissed by the Mayor of the said City. The Mayor shall in making such such appointment select the person recommended by the Operator of the Dog Pound, should such pound be operated under 7(a) hereof.

Such Officer shall have the power to bring charges in City Court against those persons violating the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: There is hereby established a Dog Pound for the City of Lebanon, Indiana. The operation of said Dog Pound may be as follows:

(a) The City may establish and operate such Dog Pound as a department of the City, furnishing all facilities, funds and personnel therefor.

(b) The City may be contacted to be executed by the Mayor and approved by the Common Council, delegate the operation of the Dog Pound to the Boone County Humane Society.

The Dog Pound Shall be operated in accordance with rules and regulations recommended by the Board of Works of said City and approved by the Common Council. Provided, However, such Pound be operated under Section 7(b) such rules shall be adopted by said Operator, submitted to the Board of Works for its review and recommendations to the Common Council.
