Clerk-Treasurer Assistant	3,960.00	330.00	monthly

SECTION 4: That the annual salaries of the members of the Utility Service Board shall be \$600.00 each.

ORDINANCE NO 75-13

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE DEFINITION AND ESTABLISHMENT
OF FIRE LANES AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR OBSTRUCTING SUCH FIRE LANES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, BOONE COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1: The word "fire lane" or "fire lanes" whenever used in this Ordinance shall be construed to mean a traffic lane or traffic lanes designated for the purpose of permitting a means of ingress and egress from public highways, streets or other like right of way to adjacent buildings, structures or improvements located and situated in the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, said lanes to be not less than 30 feet in width, the boundaries of which are to be marked in yellow, and said lanes to have painted thereon the words "FIRE LANE" in letters 12 inches in height and 4 inches in width painted upon the surface of the fire lane or lanes for easy readability by those using said lane or lanes.

Section 2: The Board of Works of the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, is hereby given the authority to order and designate the location of the fire lanes to be established and is charged with the responsibility of supervising the appropriate construction of said fire lanes by the appropriate agency or department of the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana.

SECTION 3: The parking, stopping or standing of any personal property specifically including all motor vehicles, trucks, farm tractors or other like powered vehicles, trailers, motorcycles, bicycles or other wheeled vehicles or any other means of obstructing fire lanes on both private and public property shall be prohibited at all times pursuant to the inherent and statutory powers of the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, to preserve the health, welfare and safety of its citizens. Any vehicle or other personal property found to be obstructing a fire lane shall, with the consent of the owner, lessee or any other person in possession or control of the real estate where such a fire lane has been established, be towed away upon the request of any law enforcement officer or official pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 13, 1975. The owner of such property shall be liable for all tow-in charges and resulting storage charges, if any.

SECTION 4: As the penalty for violation of this ordinance, the owner of any personal property as heretofore described found in violation of this section shall be subject of a fine of not more than \$25.00, which shall be assessed by the issuance of a parking citation pursuant to the provisions of General Ordinance No. 13, 1975.

SECTION 5: The Board of Works of the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, is further authorized and empowered to enter into a contract between the City of Lebanon and any shopping center owner or lessee from such owner of real estate located and situated within the boundary lines of the City of Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, pursuant to the provisions of Public Law No. 105, Section 11, Acts 1975, as to the establishment of any fire lane or all fire lanes necessary to permit ingress and egress to buildings, structures or improvements located and situate on said shopping center real estate and for the maintenance, control and regulation of said lane or lanes.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, signature by the Mayor and publication thereof as required by law.
