

council room while the common council is in session. The Mayor or presiding officer may order the removal from the council room of anyone who intentionally disturbs the decorum of a council member.

(3) Introduction and Adoption of Ordinances and Resolutions

(A) All ordinances shall be regularly filed with the clerk-treasurer at least one day before a regular meeting.

(B) All ordinances shall be read three times before being passed, and no ordinance shall pass on the same day in which it is introduced unless the provisions of IC-4-6-13 are complied with.

(C) Resolutions shall be subject to the same rule in method of introduction and adoption as ordinances.

(D) On the passage or adoption of any ordinance or resolution the yeas and nays shall be taken and entered in the record, and the ordinance shall be processed in accordance with IC 36-4-6-14 through 17.

(4) Questions of Order

The Mayor or presiding officer shall decide all questions of order. He or she shall decide whether any question submitted to the council for adoption or rejection is decided in the affirmative or negative.

(5) Appeal from Decision of Presiding Officer

From any decision of the presiding officer any member may appeal to the council. The appeal shall be by motion duly made and seconded. A majority vote as defined in IC 36-4-6-11 (a) is necessary to overrule the chair.

(6) Suspension of Rules

The Order of Business may be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the council, as set out by the provisions of 36-4-6-11 (b).

(E) The common council shall be composed of seven (7) members, five (5) of whom are elected from district and two (2) of whom are elected at large. The districts are as follows:

- (1) Councilmanic district one shall be composed of (to be determined)
- (2) Councilmanic district two shall be composed of (to be determined)
- (3) Councilmanic district three shall be composed of (to be determined)
- (4) Councilmanic district four shall be composed of (to be determined)
- (5) Councilmanic district five shall be composed of (to be determined)
- (6) Councilmanic district at-large shall consist of the entire city.

Redistricting of councilmanic districts shall be done in 1982 and, at least, every ten (10) years thereafter in accordance with IC 36-4-6-4.

SECTION 4: FISCAL BRANCH

The fiscal branch shall operate under the authority of the clerk-treasurer and be organized as follows:

(A) The clerk-treasurer is the fiscal officer of the City and the head of the fiscal branch. He or she shall perform the duties assigned by IC 36-4-10.

(B) The clerk-treasurer is hereby authorized, pursuant to IC 36-4-11-4, to appoint one (1) deputy clerk-treasurer to be paid from funds appropriated for the Office of Clerk-Treasurer and funds from the City Utility. Such deputy shall work under at the pleasure of the clerk-treasurer.

(C) The clerk-treasurer shall furnish space within his or her office for the administrative and records of the City's utilities. The utility clerks serve at the pleasure of the board which appointed them. The clerk-treasurer shall be compensated for services he or she renders to the City's utilities.

SECTION 5: JUDICIAL BRANCH

There shall be established a City Court of Lebanon to be headed and operated by a City Judge elected and seated pursuant to IC 33-10. 1-1-13. That the existing City Court is hereby ordered continued until further action by the common council.

SECTION 6: STATUTORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

The City shall have the following statutory boards and commissions:

(A) There shall be a Police Pension Board of Trustees to perform certain duties prescribed by IC 36-8-6 (1925 Fund) and IC 36-8-8 (1977 Fund) concerning the statutory pensions of city police.

(B) There shall be a Firefighters' Pension Board of Trustees to perform certain duties prescribed by IC 36-8-7 (1925 Fund) and IC 36-8-8 (1977 Fund) concerning the statutory pension of city firefighters.

(C) Park & Recreation Board

(D) City Plan Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals

(E) Economic Development Commission

(F) There shall be a Utility Service Board IC 8-8.5-3

SECTION 7: EXISTING BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

The Boards and Commissions of the City of Lebanon now organized and operating shall continue in operation with the same members and terms of office.

SECTION 8: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective upon passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor as prescribed by IC 36-4-6-14.
