

the compliance date of such Pretreatment Standard, or, in the case of a New Source, after commencement of the discharge into the POTW, shall submit to the Utilities Manager during the months of June and December, unless required more frequently in the Pretreatment Standard or by the Utilities Manager, a report indicating the nature and concentration, of pollutants in the effluents which are limited by such Pretreatment Standards. In addition, this report shall include a record of all daily flows which during the reporting period exceeded the average daily flow reported in paragraph 503. Flows shall be reported on the basis of actual measurement provided however, where cost or feasibility constraints justify, the Manager may accept reports of average and maximum flows estimated by verifiable techniques. At the discretion of the Utilities Manager and in consideration of such factors as local high or low flow rates, holidays, budget cycles, etc., the Utilities Manager may agree to alter the months during which the above reports are to be submitted.

- (2) Reports of permittees shall contain the results of sampling and analysis of the discharge, including the flow and the nature and concentration, or production and mass where requested by the Utilities Manager, of pollutants contained therein which are limited by the applicable Pretreatment Standards. The frequency of monitoring shall be prescribed in the applicable Pretreatment Standard. The Utilities Manager may impose mass limitations on Users which are using dilution to meet applicable Pretreatment Standards of Requirements, or in other cases where the imposition of mass limitations are appropriate. In such cases, the report required by subparagraph (1) of this paragraph shall indicate the mass of pollutants regulated by Pretreatment Standards in the effluent of the User. All analysis shall be performed in accordance with procedures established by the Administrator pursuant to Section 304(g) of the Act and contained in 40 CFR, Part 136 and amendments thereto or with any other test procedures approved by the Administrator. Sampling shall be performed in accordance with the techniques approved by the Administrator.

(Comment: Where 40 CFR, Part 136 does not include a sampling or analytical technique for the pollutant in question, sampling and analysis shall be performed in accordance with the procedures set forth in the EPA publication, Sampling and Analysis Procedures for Screening of Industrial Effluents for Priority Pollutants, April, 1977, and amendments thereto, or with any other sampling and analytical procedures approved by the Administrator.)

506. Major Contributor Permit Applications: Fees. Major contributors shall make application for the proposed discharge on a form provided by the Board. The permit application shall be supplemented by any plans, specifications, studies or other information considered pertinent by the Utilities Manager, to evaluate compatibility with the sewerage system. It is the purpose of charges and fees to provide for the recovery of costs
