

141. "National Categorical Pretreatment Standard or Pretreatment Standard" - Any regulation containing pollutant discharge limits promulgated by the EPA in accordance with Section 307(b) and (c) of the Act (33 U.S.C. 1347) which applies to a specific category (SIC No.) of Industrial Users and specifies quantities or concentrations of pollutants which may be discharged.
142. "National Prohibitive Discharge Standard or Prohibitive Discharge Standard" - Any regulation developed under the authority of 307(b) of the Act and 40 CFR, Section 403.5 and includes specific prohibitions or limits as developed by a POTW, either as a requirement of an Approved POTW Pretreatment ZProgram or an NPDES Permit.
143. "New Source" - Any source, the construction of which is commenced after the publication of proposed regulations prescribing a Section 307(c) (33 U.S.C. 1317) Categorical Pretreatment Standard which will be applicable to such source, if such standard is thereafter promulgated within 120 days of proposal in the Federal Register. Where the standard is promulgated later than 120 days after proposal, a new source means any source, the construction of which is commenced after the date of promulgation of the standard.
144. "NPDES Permit" - National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit setting forth conditions for the discharge of any pollutant or combination of pollutants to the navigable waters of the United States pursuant to Section 402 of Act.
145. "Nuisance" - Anything which is injurious to health or offensive to the senses or an obstruction to the free use of property so as to interfere with the comfort or enjoyment of life or property.
146. "Pass Through" - The discharge of pollutants by an industrial user through the POTW into navigable waters in quantities or concentrations which are a cause of or significantly contribute to a violation of any requirement of the POTW's NPDES permit (including an increase in the magnitude or duration of a violation) and as defined in 40 CFR 403 Part 403.3 (n).
147. "Person" - Any and all persons, natural or artificial, including any individual, firm, company, municipal or private corporation, partnership, copartnership, joint stock company, trust, estate, association, society, institution, enterprise, governmental agency, the State of Indiana, the United States of America, or other legal entity, or their legal representatives, agents, or assigns. The masculine gender shall include the feminine, the singular shall include the plural where indicated by the context.
148. "pH" - The logarithm (to the base 10) of the reciprocal of the hydrogen ion concentration of a solution expressed in gram atoms per liter of solution.
149. "Pollution" - An alteration of the quality of the waters of the State by waste to a degree which unreasonably affects such waters for beneficial uses or facilities which serve such beneficial uses. The manmade or man-induced alteration of the chemical, physical, biological, and radiological integrity of water.
150. "Pollutant" - Any dredged spoil, solid waste, incinerator residue, sewage, garbage, sewage sludge, munitions, chemical wastes, biological materials, radioactive materials, heat, wrecked or discharged equipment, rock, sand, cellar dirt and industrial, municipal, and agricultural waste discharged into water.
151. "Premises" - A parcel of real estate including any single improvement thereon which is determined by the Board to be a single user for purposes of receiving, using, and payment for service. Any additional improvement on the same parcel of real estate which is determined by the Board to be a user shall be separately connected to the sewerage for the purpose of receiving, using, and payment for service.
152. "Pretreatment" - The reduction of the amount of pollutants, the elimination of pollutants, or the alteration of the nature of pollutant properties in wastewater to a less harmful state prior to or in lieu of discharging of otherwise introducing such pollutants into a POTW. The reduction or alteration can be obtained by physical, chemical or biological processes, process changes or by other means, except as prohibited by 40 CFR Section 403.6(d). and shall include all applicable rules and regulations.
