AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS PROPERTY AND APPOINTMENT OF DISPOSING AGENT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, THAT:

Section 1: The Police Department of the City of Lebanon has on hand certain personal property which belongs to the City and is considered no longer fit for the purpose for which it was intended and the same should be disposed of in that it has a total estimated value of less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and is deemed no longer necessary for use by the City by the Police Chief and the Common Council. Said personal property consists of a silver-gray male German Shepherd dog, approximately two and a half years old, with an original purchase price of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). Said animal had no pedigree papers available but at the time of being declared surplus property has all of the applicable shots necessary for its health.

Section 2: The aforementioned personal property is qualified to be disposed of pursuant to I.C. 36-1-11-6(a)(2) and I.C. 36-1-11-6(a)(2).

Section 3: The Chief of Police of the City of Lebanon is hereby appointed as Disposing Agent and directed to dispose of said property under the terms of I.C. 36-1-11-6. Since the estimated value of the personal property is less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), and the same consists of only one (1) item, the Disposing Agent may sell the property at public or private sale or transfer the property without advertising.

Section 4: The Disposing Agent is hereby directed to make a report of his action under this ordinance upon completion of the sale of disposal of said property.

 $\underline{\text{Section 5:}}$ This ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage.
