

## ORDINANCE NO. 85-2

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS  
PERSONAL PROPERTY AND APPOINTMENT OF DISPOSING AGENT

WHEREAS, the City of Lebanon currently owns and maintains a 1972 model Ford chassis previously used as a pumper for the Fire Department and a 12-h.p. Hale pump, both located in the Municipal Building, with the Fire Department, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lebanon has been informed by the Fire Department Chief that equipment is no longer needed and no longer proper for the purpose for which it was intended in that the former pumper for the department is unserviceable in that the water storage tank has rusted through and cannot be repaired, and

WHEREAS, the Chief of the Fire Department has indicated that the firefighting equipment mentioned above should be sold and the proceeds applied to the acquisition of a new pumper unit with increased capacity and modernized capability to assist firefighting in the City of Lebanon,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, that:

Section 1: The Fire Department of the City of Lebanon has on hand certain personal property which belongs to the City of Lebanon and is considered unfit and no longer proper for the purpose for which it was intended and the same should be disposed of pursuant to the laws of the State of Indiana in that it has a total estimated value of more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) as shown by appropriate estimates of its value presented to the Common Council. Said personal property consists of the following:

One (1) each - Ford, Model C750 chassis, model year 1972 plus cab; Serial No. C76FVN15548; 391 C.I. gasoline engine with 5-speed manual transmission.

One (1) each - 12h.p. Hale pump, 250 gal/min. with electric start; Serial No. 69722; Model No. 25FAB23.

Section 2: The above-named personal property is qualified to be disposed of pursuant to I.C. 36-1-11-6.

Section 3: The Chief of the Lebanon Fire Department, William Williams, who is responsible for the operation of the Lebanon Fire Department, is hereby appointed as disposing agent and directed to dispose of said property under the terms of I.C. 36-1-11-6 and in cooperation with the City Building Inspector, Max Bowen, who was appointed disposing agent under Ordinance 84-29 for the disposal of the Bomag trash compactor, it being the intent of the Common Council that all items should be disposed of at on common public sale. Since the estimated value of the personal property in this Ordinance is more than the statutory amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000), and the same consists of more than one item, the disposing agent shall sell the personal property at a public auction, which is to be conducted by an auctioneer licensed under I.C. 25-6.1, after advertising the personal property for sale in accordance with I.C. 5-3-1, which in this event requires that notice shall be published two (2) times, at least one (1) week apart, with the second publication made at least three (3) days before the public sale.

Section 4: The disposing agent is hereby directed to make a report of his action under this Ordinance upon completion of the sale or disposal of said property.

Section 5: This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage.
