Section 2. The board of Public Works and Safety is directed to cause the installation of appropriate signage to inform the general public of the creation of this handicapped parking space. A violation of any of the provisions of the City Code pertaining to handicapped parking restrictions occurring after the adoption of this ordinance shall amount to a City of Lebanon ordinance violation and upon a finding of violation of such ordinance, the violator shall be fined in a sum not to exceed Twenty-five dollars (\$25). Each day of such violation shall constitute a new and separate offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and any publication which may be required of the same by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 85-9

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCES 79-5(a) and 83-7 PERTAINING TO THE CITY OF LEBANON'S INDUSTRIAL WASTE PRETREATMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Lebanon adopted an industrial waste pretreatment program by Ordinances 79-5(a) and 83-7, portions of which appear in Section 25 of the Lebanon City Code, and

WHEREAS, said pretreatment program established limitations on pollutants and wastewater strength for discharge into the municipal treatment system to preclude damage to said system of otherwise interfere with the treatment process, and

WHEREAS, pollutant and wastewater discharge categories and limits were established under Lebanon City Code Section 25-111(b) for Copper(Cu) as 2.0 mg/l and for lead (Pb) as 1.5 mg/l, and

WHEREAS, the Indiana State Board of Health, by its division of Water Pollution Control and Pretreatment Coordinator, Have caused the discharge limits of pollutants under the present ordinances to be re-evaluated and have advised the Common Council to revise the limits to
