ORDINANCE NO. 86-3

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 18, ARTICLE 1,

OF THE LEBANON CITY CODE

WHEREAS, the Lebanon Parks and Recreation Board has engaged in renovation of portions of the facilities at both Memorial Park and Abner Longley Park within the City of Lebanon and desires to maintain the current policy of restricting motor vehicle traffic to designated public ways in both parks to preserve said improvements, and

WHEREAS, the Lebanon Parks and Recreation Board further desires to close both of said parks to vehicular traffic after the hour of 11:00 p.m. during the months which it is open, and at such other times as the parks Director or Special Projects Coordinator deem appropriate as a result of inclement weather, and,

WHEREAS, a necessity exists for an amendment to the current provisions of Chapter 18 pertaining to parks and recreation in the Lebanon City Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY AND THE COMMON COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF LEBANON, INDIANA, that:

Section 1: New language be inserted into Chapter 18, Article 1, No. 18-1, as follows:

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on a public road within Abner Longley Park or Lebanon Memorial Park in the city at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour. All vehicular and motorized traffic shall be restricted to public ways designated within each of the parks' boundaries. Each park will be closed to vehicle and motorized traffic by the public at 11:00 o'clock each evening. The parking of motorized vehicles in each park will be restricted to designated areas only unless special arrangements are made for parking with the Director of Parks and Recreation or Special Projects Coordinator of the City of Lebanon.

Section 2: That a violation of the above provisions of this ordinance shall amount to a City of Lebanon ordinance violation and upon conviction of same, the violator shall be fined in a sum not to exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). Each day of such violation shall constitute a new and separate offense.
