

Section 1: Parallel and/or vertical parking shall be prohibited along or adjacent of the curb (commonly known as "fire lane") as marked about retail establishments, occupied or unoccupied, within the property of the shopping center having a contractual relationship and agreement with the City of Lebanon which defines and designates parking restrictions thereon.

Sections 2: Parking shall be prohibited in the shopping center having a contractual agreement with the City of Lebanon in the parking palces designated and striped for handicapped persons unless the individual falls under the definition of handicapped as contained in rhetorical paragraph 3 of this ordinance.

Section 3-d: Has procured and prominently displays a temporary handicapped placard as issued by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles for the State of Indiana or is qualified for, and prominently displays, handicapped license plates as issued by the State of Indiana.

Section 5: Automotiles shall be deemed improperly parked when they are on the parking lot during any hours that it is closed for public usage, unless such cars shall be properly identified as belonging to an employee of one of the stores in the shopping center. Further, the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles in the shopping center shall be limited to the amount of time required to patronize the sotres of the merchants and/or lessees of the contracting shopping center during the normal business hours of the merchants.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and any publication which may be required of the same by law.
