

I.C. 36-1-11-6. Since the estimated value of the personal property is less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) and the same consists of more than one (1) item, the disposing agents may sell the property at public or private sale or transfer the property without advertising. However, if the personal property is deemed worthless, it may be demolished or junked pursuant to said statute, provided that the successful bidder and/or purchaser of each of the items of personal property for sale shall be responsible for the removal of the same at his own expenses.

Section 4: The disposing agents are hereby directed to make a report of their actions under this Ordinance upon completion of the sale or disposal of said property.

Section 5; This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 86-15

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE II, SECTION 9-14 OF THE LEBANON CITY CODE PERTAINING TO FIRE PREVENTION CODE,

WHEREAS, the City of Lebanon, has heretofore adopted the Fire Prevention Code, Abbreviated Edition, recommended by the American Insurance Association being particularly the 1970 edition thereof, and the Lebanon City Code, Section 9-15, as adopted on or about November 26, 1962, and

WHEREAS, the Lebanon City Fire Chief has informed the Common Council of the City of Lebanon that the State of Indiana, by its legislature, has adopted the Uniform Fire Code, Edition of 1985 with Indiana Amendments, the
