ORDINANCE NO. 89-3

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY AND APPOINTMENT OF DISPOSING AGENT

BE IT ORDAINED by the common council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, that:

Section 1. The Police Department of the City of Lebanon has on hand certain personal property which belongs to the City and is considered unfit for the purpose for which it was intended and the same should be disposed of in that it has a total estimated value of less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and is deemed to be unserviceable and obsolete by the head of said Department and the Common Council. Said personal property consists of the following, to-wit: 1 IBM 3767 Computer Terminal, 1 IBM Electric Typewriter, 14 Plastic Riot Helmets, 2 boxes Misc. Spotlight Parts, 2 Polaroid Cameras, 1 box Assorted Tools, Adler Manual Typewriter, Window Blinds, 1 General Electric Radio Consul and Mike, 1 Royal Electric Typewriter, 1 Black Office Swivel Chair on casters, 1 Control Box for old siren warning system, 1 Couch, 10 Double File Cabinets, 2 Single-File Cabinets, 3 Desk Office Chairs and 2 Lamps.

Section 2. The aforementioned personal property is qualified to be disposed of pursuant to I.C. 36-1-11-6 (a) (2) and I.C. 36-1-11-6 (c) (2).

Section 3. The Chief of the Police Department is hereby appointed as Disposing Agent and directed to dispose of said property under the terms of I.C. 36-1-11-6. Since the estimated value of the personal property is less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and the same consists of more than one (1) item, the Disposing Agent may sell the property at public or private sale, or transfer the property without advertising, however, if the personal property is deemed worthless it may be demolished or junked pursuant to said statute.

Section 4. The Disposing Agent is hereby directed to make a report of his actions under this Ordinance upon completion of the sale or disposal of said property.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage.
