ORDINANCE NO. 90- 8

AN ORDINANCE CREATING AND ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF STORM WATER MANAGEMENT FOR THE CITY OF LEBANON, STATE OF INDIANA

WHEREAS, the civil City of Lebanon, the members of the Common Council thereof, and the members of the Lebanon Utility Service Board, have been apprised of deteriorating conditions in the civil City's storm water system, and having procured the services of professional engineers who have examined the City's existing system, and having made recommendations thereof, deem it appropriate that the civil City of Lebanon create a storm water management district as provided under Indiana law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, STATE OF INDIANA, as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 5 of Article 1.5 of Title 8 of the Indiana Code (I.C. 8-1.5-5-1, et seq.) addressing the matter of storm water management and the creation of a board to govern the same within the civil City of Lebanon is hereby adopted by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, State of Indiana, and by so doing makes that particular chapter of Indiana law and any and all amendments thereto effective and operative as to the civil City of Lebanon, Indiana.

Section 2: Pursuant to said Indiana law, to-wit: I.C. 8-1.5-5-1, et seq., a department of storm water management (department) shall be and is hereby created for the purpose of providing for the collection, disposal, and drainage of storm and surface water and the relieving of sanitary sewers of such water in a special taxing district which is also hereby expressly created pursuant to that chapter of Indiana law. The department shall be administered by the City of Lebanon, Department of Storm Water Management, a newly created branch of the civil City's government.

Section 3. The territory initially included in the special taxing district established by this ordinance shall be and is all of the territory now and hereinafter included within the corporate limits of the civil City of Lebanon, as established by its boundary ordinance, and any areas annexed thereto at a future date.

Section 4: The terms of the individual directors to serve on the Department of Storm Water Management shall be staggered as provided in Indiana law. The term of the first director shall end on December 31, 1990, the term of the second director shall end on December 31, 1991; and the term of the third director shall end on December 31, 1992. All successor terms will be for a period of three (3) years. Not more than two directors of the Department of Storm Water Management shall be
