

Ordinance No. 96-17

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE LEBANON
AUXILIARY POLICE

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Safety for the City of Lebanon and the Mayor of the City of Lebanon recognize the importance of an auxiliary police force in the City of Lebanon; and

WHEREAS, the auxiliary police force lends invaluable help and aid during public functions and performs duties on behalf of the citizens of the City of Lebanon which otherwise would fall upon the regular police and fire forces; and

WHEREAS, the Lebanon auxiliary police force, formerly the Civil Defense, will function in support of the City's public safety forces.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby established an auxiliary police force to be known as the Lebanon Auxiliary Police.

Section 2. That the director and deputy director of the Lebanon Auxiliary Police shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Public Safety and both the director and deputy director shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City of Lebanon for a specified term.

Section 3. That the Lebanon Auxiliary Police Force shall function under the direction of the Mayor of the City of Lebanon and in the Mayor's absence, under the direction of the Mayor Pro Tem and in the absence of the Mayor Pro Tem, under the direction of the Lebanon City Police Chief.


Section 4. That the Lebanon Auxiliary Police Force is authorized to adopt its own by-laws and policies in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. The members of the Lebanon Auxiliary Police shall not have arrest powers except on an emergency basis after the formal declaration of an emergency or martial law by the Mayor or in the Mayor's absence by the Mayor Pro Tem of the City


of Lebanon, Indiana. Where a member of the Lebanon Auxiliary Police force, at his or her own expense, has attended and passed the twelve (12) week course at the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy, arrest powers may be available to such member subject to the approval of the Board of Public Safety.


Section 6. The Lebanon Auxiliary Police Force is a service organization which, as directed by the Mayor, shall help coordinate traffic flow, crowd control, parking at public events, and security at public functions under the direction and as authorized by the City of Lebanon Police Chief.


All of which is CONSIDERED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED by the Common Council of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, this 9th day of September, 1996.







Taxpayers appearing shall have a right to be heard thereon. After the tax rates have been determined and presented to the county auditor not later than two days prior to the second Monday in September, and the rate fixed by the county tax adjustment board, or on their failure so to do, by the county auditor, ten or more taxpayers feeling themselves aggrieved by such rates, may appeal to the state board of tax commissioners for further and final hearing thereon by filing a petition with the county auditor on or before the tenth day after publication of the county auditor of tax rates charged, and the state board of tax commissioners will fix a date for hearing in this county.

ORDINANCE FOR APPROPRIATIONS AND TAX RATES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY, CITY OR TOWN OF LEBANON, INDIANA, THAT FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE COUNTY, CITY OR TOWN GOVERNMENT AND ITS INSTITUTIONS FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1997, THE SUMS OF MONEY SHOWN ON BUDGET FORM 4-A ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED AND ORDERED SET APART OUT OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS HEREIN MENTIONED AND FOR THE PURPOSE HEREIN SPECIFIED, SUBJECT TO THE LAWS GOVERNING THE SAME. SUCH SUMS HEREIN APPROPRIATED SHALL BE HELD TO INCLUDE ALL EXPENDITURES AUTHORIZED TO BE MADE DURING THE YEAR, UNLESS OTHERWISE EXPRESSLY STIPULATED AND PROVIDED FOR BY LAW. IN ADDITION FOR THE PURPOSE OF RAISING REVENUE TO MEET THE NECESSARY EXPENSE OF COUNTY, CITY OR TOWN GOVERNMENT, TAX RATES ARE SHOWN ON BUDGET FORM 4-9 AND INCLUDED HEREIN. TWO(2) COPIES OF BUDGET FORMS 4-A AND 4-9 FOR ALL FUNDS AND DEPARTMENTS ARE MADE A PART OF THE BUDGET REPORT AND SUBMITTED HEREWITH.
