

ORDINANCE NO. 10 - 23

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF LEBANON BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2011

SECTION 1: BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of Lebanon, Indiana, two-thirds of its members being present and concurring therein:

SECTION 2: That the maximum salaries of the following elected officials of the City of Lebanon, beginning January 1, 2011, be as follows:

MAYOR	\$46,000
CLERK-TREASURER	\$47,500
COMMON COUNCIL (7)	\$35,000
JUDGE	\$17,000

SECTION 3: In addition to funds paid by the Civil City as set out in Section 2 above, the following elected and appointed officers to be paid from funds of the Municipal Utilities are as follows:

MAYOR	\$22,750
CLERK-TREASURER	\$12,350
DEPUTY CLERK TREASURER	\$21,325

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall take effect January 1, 2011.




